







# 8<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the ESF Managing Authorities of the Danube Region | Summary 1 June 2021 | Online

#### Introduction

Priority Coordinators of the EU Strategy of the Danube Region of the Priority Areas 9 "People and Skills", Roland Hanak, and Priority Area 10 "Institutional capacity and Cooperation", Claudia Singer, opened the meeting and welcomed the participants. Michal Blaško, EUSDR Presidency Slovakia, welcomed the participants as well as the endeavor of this network to work towards embedding and better coordination of funding in the Danube Region.

#### State of Play ESF+ Operational Programmes

The participants shared the current state of play in ESF+ programming with a particular focus on (expected) selected topics, the next steps of the programming process, institutional setting (with a specific focus on changes in comparison to the previous funding period), and (potential) links to the EUSDR and transnational cooperation (TC).



The list of topics for transnational cooperation was discussed and updated according to progress in national programming:
















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In the context of transnational cooperation possibilities Barbara Willsberger (PA9, L&R Social Research) introduced the new project "SI PLUS", which is funded under the Easl Programme and brings together 7 countries (Austria, Baden-Württemberg, Slovakia, Hungary, Slovenia, Croatia, and Bulgaria) from the Danube Regions to establish National Competence Centres for Social Innovation. The project is also going to serve as a platform for transnational exchange. Marianne Doyen (EC, DG EMPL) added that the DG EMPL is ready to help and contribute to this project.

Claudia Singer (PAC10) provided an overview on how to integrate TNC into national OPs, reaching from transnational capitalization up to coordinated calls. Barbara Willsberger highlighted the importance of sharing experience in this respect. The Presidency and DSP stressed the importance of the ESF MA network, which serves as a model for the ERDF/CF and IPA/NDICI networks in the EUSDR context.

## Outlook

Barbara Willsberger and Claudia Singer thanked the participants for their contributions. The next meeting should take place in autumn 2021 and offers the opportunity to exchange on good practice examples that can be picked up for transnational cooperation in the ESF+. At this point of time the programming phase should be at a much more advanced stage, which gives the opportunity to discuss the thematic cooperation in more detail but also possible tools for cooperation.

Michal Blaško (Presidency) proposed to hold the next meeting of the ESF MA network in the framework of the next Annual Forum of the EUSDR in October 2021.
