4th Danube Participation Day/Roma Participation Partnership 17 October 2017 in Budapest, Hungary

The 4th Danube Participation Day took place at the Andrássy University Budapest (HU) on the 17th October 2017, back to back with the EUSDR Annual Forum 2017. The conference addressed the issue "Science meets Participation, Innovation and Sustainability – The Agenda for Participation in EU Macro-Regional Strategies" and marked the start of the "Agenda for Participation". PA9 contributed as Lead Partners of the Participation Partnership "Roma Empowerment". The Partnership deals with participatory approaches to empower Roma communities in the macro- regions in order to enable their participation in the shaping of their social and political capital. The Participation Partnerships "Empowerig Roma" is designed as standing working groups of different stakeholders (experts, project promoters, policy-makers) that facilitate exchange of information, activities and good practice examples as well as coordination and a possibility to develop initiatives and/or projects in the field of Roma empowerment. Preparation Workshop 'Danube Region Monitor'

The PA9 is aiming to increase the evidence-base for Danube Region policy. As a result a so-called 'Danube Region Monitor' is being developed to visualize developments in the Danube Region and making necessary policy actions evident. The output will be the base for recommendations for the implementation of successful measures in the field of education and labour market. The first preparation workshop for the 'Danube Region Monitor' has taken place on December 6th in Vienna. The workshop has been organised with researchers and statistic experts from the Danube Region to identify relevant indicators and benchmarks out of a set of already existing indicators and benchmarks (e.g. Eurostat, PISA PIAAC & studies on national level) in the fields of education and labour market.

Danube Strategic Project Fund (DSPF): Financing macro-regional cooperation

The Danube Strategic Project Fund is a facility aiming at supporting the implementation of transnational strategic projects aligned with the objectives of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region (EUSDR). The instrument is aiming at supporting initiatives at the interface between cohesion and enlargement/neighbourhood policy. The call for applications was open until February 2017. Two PA9 projects have been selected for funding: I-VET from Kulturkontakt Austria and DIY-ACCEL from Business Support Centre for Small and Medium Enterprises-Rus. More info
