## **Ukraine: Associated County**



Ukraine, Norway, Iceland, and Moldova are associated to the EU4Health Programme

In **July 2022**, the European Commission signed an agreement associating **Ukraine** with the EU4Health Programme

The agreement is retroactive to 1 January 2022, allowing Ukrainian health authorities and community actors to have access to EU4Health funds on equal footing with those from EU countries

### **EU4Health Annual Work Programmes – 6 types of Grants**





- Open calls for Operating Grants
- Open Calls for Action Grants
- Joint Actions with Member States Authorities
- Direct Grants to Member States Authorities (other than Joint Actions)
- Direct Grants to International Organisations
- Direct Grants to specific beneficiaries i.e., European Reference Networks (ERNs)





### **Action Grants**

- Open Calls for proposals
- An action intended to help achieve a Union policy objective
- Type of organisations: legally established entity, i.e., private or public bodies, (non)governmental organisations, research and (public)health institutions, universities and higher education establishments, etc.
- Minimum Number of legal entities and geographical coverage: at least 3 participating entities (independent from each other) from at least three countries participating in the EU4Health Programme.

### Selection criteria

- Financial capacity: Applicants must guarantee stable and sufficient sources of funding to maintain their activity throughout the activity period and to participate the co-financing.
- Operational capacity: Applicants must provide professional resources, competences and qualifications required to complete the proposed action



## **Annual Work Programme 2022**



Topic EU4H-2022-PJ-09: Call for proposals on promoting mental health – implementing promising best practice(s) to improve mental health and psychosocial wellbeing in migrant and refugee populations

Main expected impact: contribute to the mitigation of major mental health and psychologically traumatic experiences of refugees and displaced people as a consequence of the Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine.

### **Specific action-level indicators:**

- ✓Number of training materials translated by number of languages
- ✓ Number of health professionals and NGOs making use of the training material
- ✓ Number of displaced people from Ukraine benefiting from the action (by country)

### **Joint Actions**

Joint Action grants are awarded without calls for proposals

A Joint Action is a direct grant consisting in collaborative action among Member States and Associated Countries participating in the EU4Health Programme → Creation of a single consortium

Each country participating in the EU4Health Programme is invited to nominate one competent authority, which will become the grant beneficiary and be responsible for the implementation of the action on its behalf.

The nominated competent authority may involve in the grant under its responsibility other participants, such as affiliated entities

#### For Joint Actions, affiliated entities cover:

The different levels of the administrative structure in case of decentralised administration (e.g., national, regional or local administrations),

or/and Public sector bodies (e.g., national institutes or schools for public health or national research centres) which and are (at least in part) publicly funded to deliver a public or government service or are in situation of control by a state organization/other public body. What is not an affiliated entity?

Entities that have entered into a (procurement) contract or subcontract with the competent authority (beneficiary), or who act as concessionaires or delegates for public services for the beneficiary.

Entities that cooperate with the beneficiary on the basis of a memorandum of understanding or share some assets.
