1. What is the Danube Strategic Project Fund? (I)

- A new facility aiming at supporting the implementation of transnational strategic projects aligned with the objectives of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region (EUSDR)
- Has specific added value at the interfaces between cohesion and enlargement/ neighbourhood policy
- Is co-financed by the European Commission: 97% and the City of Vienna 3%
- Lasts from **01.09.2016 31.08.2019** (36 months)

Main principles & objectives of the DSPF

- The DSPF will build upon the pilot initiatives START Danube Region Project
 Fund and TAF-DRP (Technical Assistance Facility for Danube Region Projects)
- primarily focuses on innovative pre-mature projects which could not be funded so far
- will provide support for projects and initiatives which do not fit into a programme or funding scheme



1. What is the Danube Strategic Project Fund? (II)

The DSPF will provide financial support to projects that:

- Have a strategic impact, especially in view of Enlargement and Neighbourhood policies;
- Include cross-cutting and/or horizontal measures covering several Priority Areas of the Strategy;
- Follow a multi-level governance approach;
- Support the establishment of economic and social cooperation;
- Foster integration and reconciliation of Danube countries, with a particular focus on the role of young people

Projects supported by the DSPF can be implemented by:

- National, regional and local authorities;
- SMEs (start-ups);
- Academies and Universities (in particular applied research and development units);
- Social partners and relevant associations.



1. What is the Danube Strategic Project Fund? (III)

The financial support to DSPF projects:

- Max € 100.000,00 / project
- Max. € 969.000,00 in total

DSPF projects:

- Approx. 10-12 projects will be supported
- Approx. 12 months duration



2. Role of involved bodies (I)

1. EUSDR Priority Area Coordinator 10 / (City of Vienna, Austria): DI Rudolf Schicker

Responsible for stepping up institutional capacity and cooperation in the Danube Region and the implementation of the EU Initiative Danube Strategic Project Fund (DSPF) as **Managing Authority** in close cooperation with EC-DG Regio.

2. EuroVienna (Implementing Body – IB):

Affiliated entity to PAC10, the City of Vienna and **Implementing Body (IB)** in regard to the Danube Strategic Project Fund (DSPF)

- Supports PAC10 and will provide technical assistance to the Advisory Board, the DSPF Jury and the Lead Partners of the DSPF projects
- Will conduct a formal check of received applications (on technical eligibility criteria)
- Will act as **contracting body** to the Lead Partners of the selected DSPF projects **Project Managers / Contact Persons:**

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3. Role of involved bodies (II)

3. Advisory Board (AB)

The AB is composed of experts **strongly involved in the macro region EUSDR** and/or in the **process of enlargement and neighbourhood policies**.

The AB has the following main responsibilities:

- Making recommendations for selection criteria for DSPF projects to be considered by the Jury
- Making recommendations for setting up the DSPF selection Jury
- Making recommendations to a limited number of DSPF project applications to the Jury (pre-assessment)

4. DSPF Jury

The members of the Jury are composed by EC-DG Regio, PAC 10 and nominees of the Advisory Board. The jury will **select the DSPF projects** that will receive funding through the initiative.



4. Application Process

Application Procedure

Closed application procedure

A certain group of persons/organisations (experts) will be nominated to identify potential applicants

- **2 step: procedure** is foreseen
 - 1st step: short application & budget overview
 - → IB will conduct a formal check
 - → Advisory Board will conduct a pre-assessment
 - 2nd step: more detailed description of the project & project budget plan for preselected projects
- Final decision will be done by DSPF Jury
 - → exact procedure is elaborated right now



5. Timeline of the initiative

<u>Assessment of applications - 1st step:</u> (formal check, pre-assessment by Advisory Board)	Feb. – April 2017
Refinement of best applications – 2nd step: (more detailed project descriptions & project budget plan)	May – June 2017
Project selection by DSPF Jury	July / August 2017
Project Implementation	September 2017 – August 2018 (Dec. 2018)
