

#### THE SUMMARY

#### **POLICY**

- Focus on synergetic actions and targets with added value aligned to EU policies, especially the 5 policy objectives of the Regional Development and Cohesion Policy
- Enforce political support of national governments via stronger communication and improved monitoring and reporting to achieve genuine interest of political stakeholders.
- Focus rather on a selected number of targets and actions which are in focus of most EUSDR member states, being optimally linked with evaluation and monitoring of the EUSDR (bearing in mind that PACs are not project implementers)

#### **GOVERNANCE**

- Ensuring the long term commitment and involvement of the EUSDR stakeholders, boosting cooperation between the PAs and on MRS's level
- Establishing models and good practices for obtaining results and proving/increasing the added value of the EUSDR,
- Establishing a sound evaluation and monitoring of the implementation of EUSDR.
- Some of the PAs stated that special attention should be given to the processes generated within EUSDR, following the models provided by EUSBR;

#### **FUNDING/FINANCING**

- Cooperation with private companies and SME's

#### **TECHNICAL MATTERS**

- Each PA indicated several topics considered of future priority in order to respond to the challenges identified in the region.

#### THE SUMMARY - CC-ISSUES

Out of the findings following major fields can be extracted (correlation between 3 and 5):

- TRANSPORT, INFRASTRUCTURE, EURO-ASIAN CONNECTIONS, TEN-T NETWORKS
  being a vital part of connecting the region on road, rail, water and air concerns 2 Pillars
  (1a, 1b, 4, 5, 6);
- DECARBONISATION of the transport system, GREEN CORRIDOR between Turkey and Central-Europe affects 3 Pillars (1b, 2, 3, 5, 6, 8);
- Implementation of the WATER FRAMEWORK DIRECTIVE and its daughter Directives and of the JOINT PROGRAMME OF MEASURES OF THE INTEGRATED DANUBE RIVER BASIN MANAGEMENT PLAN concerns 3 Pillars (1a, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 10);
- ECOLOGY (Masterplan for the EUSDR) and CLIMATE CHANGE concern 2 Pillars (1a, 1b, 5, 6);
- EDUCATION as horizontal principle concerns 4 Pillars (1a, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 10);
- **DIGITALISATION** as strategic horizontal principle named (throughout the reports) by several PAs; high importance: **7 PAs from 3 Pillars (1a, 1b, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11)**














Question 2: How do you see further involvement of Non-EU countries within the Priority Areas coordination? a) By creating new Priority Areas?



















## STRUCTURE OF THE CONSOLIDATED INPUT FOR THE REVISION OF THE EUSDR ACTION PLAN

At the NC meeting in Bucharest on 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> February, chaired by the Romanian EUSDR Presidency, the NCs agreed on the following structure for the *Consolidated Input for the Revision of the EUSDR Action Plan*, as proposed by DSP (and as intended to be issued by 14<sup>th</sup> May 2019).

- 1. Scope of the Revision Process of the EUSDR Action Plan
- 2. <u>Description of the Revision Process of the EUSDR Action Plan</u>
- 3. Results and recommendations from the evaluation
- 4. Proposals for drafting a narrative for the EUSDR













### 5. Strategic objectives for increasing the quality of living in the Danube Region

- Policy and specific objectives (draft Cohesion Policy Legislative Package 2021–2027): a smarter Europe, a greener, low-carbon and resilient Europe, a more connected Europe, a more social Europe and Europe closer to citizens.
- Additional objectives and priorities of other draft regulations for the programming period 2021 2027 should also be considered, as well as the sustainable development goals (SDGs): The Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance (IPAIII); the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument (NDICI); the Connecting Europe Facility, Digital Europe programme, Horizon Europe, Life+, etc.
- Possible cross-cutting objectives (as horizontal principles for EUSDR): encouraging digitalization, transport infrastructure, civil society participation, education & skills, youth, sustainable development, equal opportunity and non-discrimination, and others.











#### 6. Priorities and Pillars: Objectives and targets

 Priority Areas will be clustered in pillars. The horizontal principles between the Priority Areas will be described separately. In relationship to the number of targets the number of coordinators per Priority Area shall be determined (2 to 3) in view of further involvement of non-EU countries. A monitoring procedure (including baseline indicators) related to the targets shall be set out.

#### 7. Governance of EUSDR

- Internal governance (role and responsibilities of: High Level Group, NCs, PACs, interrelation of NCs and PACs, Steering Groups, Stakeholder groups, DSP, Presidency, TRIO, DG Regio)
- External governance (cooperation and communication with: line DGs, Civil Society, national, regional and local authorities and their organizations, stakeholders, promotors, the academia, the media, EP, CoR, EESC)
- Cooperation with other MRS and sea-basin strategies (with the support of INTERACT and DG Regio)











#### 8. Interplay of EUSDR with European funding facilities

- ESIF actors (DG Regio, DG Empl, Managing Authorities and Joint Secretariats)
- Actors in the field of enlargement and neighbourhood policy (DG NEAR, IPAIII, NDICI)
- Central funding facilities (Connecting Europe Facility, Horizon Europe, Erasmus, Life, etc.)
- Financial instruments, EIB, EBRD, World Bank, National and Private funding facilities, including development cooperation agencies, funds and promotion agencies
